3. Extracted honey to be judged on body, clarity and cleanliness
4. Beeswax to be judged on color purity
5. Exhibits can be entered on June 23, 2024 from 2-4pm or June 24,2024 from 12-8pm. Exhibits can be picked up June 30,2024 from 2-4 pm

Class 1 Bees, any race- one frame observation hive \$10, \$8,\$6

- A. Light comb, three sections
- B. Dark comb, three sections
- C. Light extracted honey, one 1 lb jar
- D. Amber extracted honey, one 1lb jar
- E. Dark Amber extracted honey, one 1lb jar
- F. Finely crystallizes, one 1lb jar

Class 2 Honey- \$5,\$4,\$3

Class 3 beeswax-1lb-\$5,\$4,\$3

Class 4 display of or exhibit of honey products-\$5,\$4,\$3

Class 5 best of show Ribbon

Section 2- Maple Syrup and maple products

1. Syrup to be judged on flavor, color, density and clarity
2. Sugar is to be judged on flavor, appearance and texture
3. Premium-\$9,\$7,\$5
4. Exhibits can be entered on June 23, 2024 from 2-4pm or June 24,2024 from 12-8pm. Exhibits can be picked up June 30,2024 from 2-4 pm

Class:

1. Maple syrup, one pint container
2. Maple sugar, ½ pound cake
3. Maple cream,½ pound cake
4. Maple sugar, soft, small indiv. cake,½ pounds
5. Collective exhibit- shall be made up of small samples, at least one of each, corresponding to those in each of the foregoing classes
