Section 5- Artistic Arrangements

1. Maximum care will be taken of the containers and accessories until they can be reclaimed by exhibitors but the Fair cannot be held responsible for any damage or loss.
2. Arrangements must not exceed 24" in height
3. The Artistic Arrangement class is for amateurs only and must be made from garden grown flowers or wildflowers found growing in this area.

Class:

1. Arrangement of one variety of flowers
2. Flowers for a sick room
3. Wildflower Arrangement, Conservation rules must be used
4. Summer memories, dried material accessories permitted
5. Arrangement in a teapot
6. Arrangement using weathered wood with bird or animal
7. Autumn Jewels
8. Arrangement for family dinner table, Color Harmony
9. Arrangement using tints shades of one color of flowers
10. Golden treasury use flowers in shades of yellow
11. Fruit and/or vegetable arrangement with flowers of foliage
12. A centerpiece using one or more candles
13. Arrangement in pedestal container
14. Fair theme arrangement
15. Arrangement depicting a holiday or special occasion

Section 7- Garden in Wheelbarrow or Kid's Wagon

Rules:

1. Each garden is permitted one sign with the entrant's name and place of business, individual or organization in addition, you are encouraged to label plants.
2. Live plants must be used. Decorations can be added. You may use any size wheelbarrow or kid's wagon
3. Displays will be used to beautify the grounds during the Mercer County Grange Fair.
4. Displays can be removed after the close of the fair or left in place to beautify the grounds for the rest of the summer
5. Entries will be judge on color, plant combination overall appearance and originality
6. Prizes will be awarded based on accomplishment and appearance
7. **PRIZE- 1st-\$75, 2nd-\$50, 3rd-\$25**

Section 8- Hanging Baskets(supply own hooks)

1. All plants must be grown by owner and have been in possession for at least 3 months
2. The Uniformity of height or size is an important factor in evaluating entries.
3. Each basket in entry must be of one variety unless otherwise stated.
